1. Introductions to the Board

• Introductions were made by current board members to welcome new attendees and community guests.

2. Introductions to Community Resources

- Community Policing Officers (CPOs)
 - Officers: Samantha Schmeltz and Maney, who have been part of the Community Policing unit for two years, primarily serving the Edison area.
 - Crime Statistics: The most common crimes are larcenies from vehicles (often involving juveniles) and aggravated assaults (mainly domestic incidents). Crime peaks during Friday and Saturday mornings.
 - Crime Hotspots: High call volumes are noted at Banbury Road apartments.
 - o Initiatives:
 - **Gun Amnesty Program**: Partnering with local churches to collect firearms anonymously.
 - Fusus Camera Program: A camera-sharing program enabling businesses and residents to control police access to footage for safety purposes.
 - **Traffic Enforcement**: Acknowledged the need for additional trained officers and better signage on Portage Road's exit ramps.
 - **Speed Bumps**: Recent installations in Edison have improved neighborhood traffic safety.
- County Commissioner (John Taylor)
 - Budget and Homelessness Initiatives: Reviewed the new county budget and discussed a neighborhood homelessness shelter project designed to keep families together and provide a pathway to permanent housing.
 - Community Connection: Commissioner Taylor will ensure direct communication between the MNA and county representatives on homelessness projects.

 Housing Developments: The Old Residence Inn building will be repurposed into apartments, with a new complex planned for Portage Road.

• City Commissioner (Chris Praedel)

- Infrastructure Improvements: A Department of Transportation grant will fund road improvements for Cork Street, Lovers Lane, and Portage Road by 2026.
- Park and Utility Updates: Neighborhood parks have been or will be upgraded, and 5,000 lead service lines have been replaced in Kalamazoo.
- Early Voting: New polling locations are opening at the Expo Center, Douglass Community Center, Parks & Rec, and one additional site.

3. Recent Events and Objectives

Completed Events and Accomplishments:

- National Night Out: MNA partnered with Greenwood Reformed Church and Thread Church for the event.
- Imagine Kalamazoo 2035: MNA participated in city planning initiatives.
- One Well Block Party: Held a successful community event, including face painting for neighborhood engagement.
- o **By-Laws**: By-laws were completed by Jax.
- **Food Drive**: A food drive was organized with Milwood Elementary to benefit Loaves and Fishes, with fliers and details set for distribution.

Goals and Ongoing Partnerships:

- Happy Cities Program: MNA board members are participating to support community well-being initiatives.
- City Planning Feedback: Plans to attend upcoming city feedback sessions for Imagine Kalamazoo.
- Elementary School Partnership: MNA intends to increase support for Greenwood Elementary and engage the broader neighborhood.
